## **Historic Sites**

*Allen A.M.E. Church (1911)* –Northport, presently private residence.

*Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church and Cemetery (1843)* – Park Avenue, Huntington

*Booker T. Washington House* – Fort Salonga

*George Wood House* – West Shore Road, Huntington (a Cooper by trade).

*Henry Lloyd Manor House (1711)* – Lloyd Neck, Jupiter Hammon’s Birthplace

*Huntington Rural Cemetery* – New York Avenue, Huntington resting place of Samuel Ballton.

*John Coltrane House*, Dix Hills

*Joseph Lloyd Manor House (1767)* – Lloyd Neck, Jupiter Hammon served there.

*Old Burying Ground* - Main Street, Huntington

*Peter Crippen Homestead* – African-American owned since 1863 – Private residence

*Rube Dow House* – West Shore Road, Huntington (a weaver by trade)

*Samuel Ballton, Pickle King of Greenlawn* – some of the houses he built in the late 1800’s still stand today in Greenlawn.

*Scudder Homestead (1750)* – presently Cow Harbor Inn, Northport. Elijah’s birthplace

*Platt’s Tavern site (battle 1779)* – Park Avenue, Huntington Elijah’s home

*Latting’s Hundred (1653)* – Huntington Manumission Site, 1805-1823. Private residence
